Relaunch of the Regulator

On May 29th, 2018, President Petro Poroshenko appointed 5 new NEURC Comissioners: Oleksandr Formahei, Olena Antonova, Oksana Kryvenko, Dmytro Kovalenko and Yevhen Mahlevany. At welcome ceremony in the President's Administration Francis Malige (EBRD Managing Director in Eastern Europe and the Caucasus), Satu Kahkonen (Country Director of the World Bank for Belarus, Moldova and Ukraine) and Goesta Ljungman (IMF Resident Representative in Ukraine) praised this long-awaited decision.

In accordance with the previously approved NEURC rotation scheme, the President dismissed the NEURC Chairman, Dmytro Vovk, as well as NEURC Commissioner Ruslan Mashlyakivskiy. Their terms of office expired on May 26th.

Roundtable on Ukrainian Energy Security

The importance of a "truly independent Regulator" was underlined by Edward Chow, Senior Fellow at the Centre for Strategic and International Studies, and Torsten Wöllert, Team Leader for Energy & Environment of the EC Support Group for Ukraine, during the <u>panel discussion</u> "Three Components of Ukraine's Energy Security: Reforms, Investments, European Integration", which was held by the Razumkov Centre on May 30th in Kyiv.

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These experts, together with one more co-panellist Volodymyr Omelchenko, Energy Programmes Director at the Razumkov Centre, also exchanged opinions on key issues and factors affecting energy security of Ukraine: availability, reliability and affordability of energy resources and resilience of energy sector depend on continuous reform and its public acceptance.

National Coal Company is to start functioning in 2-3 months

Deputy Minister of Energy and Coal Industry of Ukraine Anatoly Korzun informed that the National Coal Company, established in December 2017, will start its operations in 2-3 months. The company aimed at integrating 33 stateowned mines will improve their financial performance and enhance the sector management.

As Vice Prime Minister of Ukraine Volodymyr Kistion stated, the National Coal Company should save about UAH 1.5 bln per year. The newly established company is under the control of the Ministry of Energy and Coal Industry.

Russian Federation halted transit coal supplies through Ukrainian ports

Since May 1st, 2018, Russian companies stopped transit coal supplies through Ukrainian ports without explanation.

According to the information from the market players, volumes of the transit coal from Russia through Ukraine amounted to 1-1.8 mln tonnes per month. The transit coal was transported to Ukrainian ports and Western border points of Ukraine.

Major recipients of this coal were Turkey, Poland, Romania, Slovakia, Czech Republic, Hungary and other European countries and countries of Asia and Africa.

DTEK has launched fast EV charging network STRUM

A 15-20-minute charging averagely will provide about 50-100 km of driving distance. Charging equipment is manufactured by ABB in compliance with international standards and is fully certified. The first 8 EV chargers have already started working in Kyiv in a test mode. EV stations are located at the parking spaces of the largest shopping and business centers, as well as at the fuel-filling stations of one of the Ukrainian network.
